Bridge II Sports Receives \$40,000 Grant from The Hartford for New Adaptive Sports Equipment and Programming

Two Local Youth Surprised With Custom-Fit Sport Wheelchairs

DURHAM, N.C. — **November 2, 2020** — Bridge II Sports, a non-profit organization based in Durham, N.C., which is committed to creating opportunities for youth and adults with physical disabilities through the power of adaptive sports, was recently awarded a grant from The Hartford as part of its Ability Equipped® program.

The grant will enable Bridge II Sports, a member of the Move United Network, to purchase nine new sport chairs which will be used by their youth wheelchair basketball team, The PRIDE (Perseverance, Resilience, Integrity, Determination, and Empowerment) and expand its EveryBODYPlaysNC programming in public schools statewide.

The Hartford is also providing two Bridge II Sport youth athletes with their own custom-fit sport wheelchairs to foster their passion for wheelchair basketball. These athletes were chosen by Bridge II Sport staff because they show enthusiasm and commitment to fitness, determination to excel in wheelchair basketball and are active program participants. Bridge II Sports youth athletes, Jillian a 14-year-old girl and Bryson a 15-year-old boy, will receive their new sport wheelchairs in a surprise reveal on Saturday, November 7, 2020.

"I am so thankful to The Hartford and its Ability Equipped program. These funds make it possible for Bridge II Sports to grow our equipment inventory and better serve the community. Adaptive sports equipment is expensive and for many families, it is a financial hardship to purchase specialized equipment. I am so proud of the two youth who are receiving their own chairs. They have an aspiration to continue playing their sport in college and staying active for life. This is a celebration of opportunity and access!" stated Ashley Thomas, Founder and CEO of Bridge II Sports.

The Hartford has been an advocate for the adaptive sports movement and sponsor of athletes with disabilities for more than 25 years. As a leading provider of disability insurance, the company has a long-held belief that sports are an important part of physical rehabilitation following a disabling illness or injury. In 2019, the company created its Ability Equipped® program to make adaptive sports and equipment more accessible to youth and adults with disabilities.

On Saturday, November 7th, staff, volunteers, and Team PRIDE members will 'surprise' athletes Jillian and Bryson with a sport chair reveal celebration before skills practice at the Bridge II Sports campus. After the reveal, all athletes will try out the club's nine new sport chairs.

Meet Jillian:

Jillian is a 14-year-old high school freshman who was born with Tibia Hemimelia and a clubfoot. She has a shorter tibia in one leg leading to leg length discrepancy. Jillian began playing wheelchair basketball with Bridge II Sports in 2015. "Over the years she has grown to become the leader and captain of the team with the skills to match," commented Coach Akeem Hassell. "I can see the raw potential in her in how she handles the chair and her body movement on the court. She has made a lot of growth in a short period of time."

Jillian has been playing with Bridge II Sports for five years. She also competes with an adult team, the Triangle Thunder. She is expanding into a second sport and is on pace to join the track team at her high school and compete in a racing chair.

Jillian aspires to go on to play at the next level and already has a few eyes from collegiate teams.

Meet Bryson:

Bryson began playing wheelchair basketball this past year. He was introduced to the sport by Bridge II Sports and has demonstrated an enviable amount of talent and know-how for the game.

"Bryson just has this true athleticism and strength. His goal is to be better than me...I have to say, I think it is possible for sure," said Coach Akeem.

Bryson was born with Spina Bifida and uses a wheelchair for mobility. Having his own sport chair will allow Bryson to practice at home and continue his athletic path that does not have an end in sight.
